**The log is very important and must be completely filled out.**

2. Choose one of the activities listed on the back or be creative and make up an activity on your own.
3. Turn in your completed work **and** reading log to Mrs. Famolaro, in the Media Center by Friday, September 17, 2010. Activities need to be completed fully and neatly so they may go on display. Please make sure that your **first and last name, Sept. 2010 grade level**, and your **new teacher's name** are written on your papers. When your project and log are turned in, your picture will be taken in our "Pirate Theme" to be placed on our "pirate ship" outside of the library. This year we will have a "**Pirate Day**" (for all ye maties who completed thar reading) where you will be allowed to dress in pirate attire! So get started and have fun!!
